In MP, 18% men diabetic

Vaccination coverage improved, with 81.5% of children aged 12-23 months reported to be fully vaccinated, compared with 77.4% earlier. The survey also indicated improvements in women's empowerment and a decline in gender-based violence. The proportion of married women participating in household decision-making rose from 86% to 90.4% over the past four years. Women owning and independently using a mobile phone increased from 38.5% in 2019 to 48.5%. The percentage of women using hygienic methods of protection during menstruation rose from 61% to 65%. Meanwhile, the proportion of women who reported ever experiencing spousal violence declined from 28% to 21%.

Fuel retailers told to build...

The government has asked state-run oil marketing companies Indian Oil Corp (IOC), Bharat Petroleum Corp Ltd (BPCL) and Hindustan Petroleum Corp Ltd (HPCL) to prepare plans for the additional storage over and above regular commercial inventories. The war in West Asia disrupted global energy supplies, including those to India. India's 40 per cent of crude imports, 65 per cent of natural gas and 90 per cent LPG supplies, that came from countries in the Gulf region, was disrupted due to the three-month long conflict. While it has been able to source crude oil (raw material for making petrol and diesel) and natural gas (used to generate electricity, make fertiliser and turned into CNG to run automobiles as well as piped to household kitchens for cooking), the disruption in LPG supplies to be regulating supplies to commercial users.

Dr K Radhakrishnan, who heads the monitoring committee constituted by the Supreme Court in 2024 to recommend reforms for NEET, appeared before the Bench pursuant to an earlier order. HC directs...

The court directed that the respondents shall come out with specific averments regarding the preventive and curative measures taken by them in the matter of tiger deaths in the Kanha National Park along with their reply, which they must file within two weeks. Notices returnable in two weeks were served on the Union and State governments, the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA), the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Wildlife), the Chief Wildlife Warden of Madhya Pradesh and the field director of the Kanha Tiger Reserve. The PIL stated that there were over eight tiger mortal-

ities, including the T141 tigrress and her cubs, in April 2026. The latest death occurred on May 19, 2026, when a young male tiger, T-220, named Mahaveer, died with the cause being reported as suspected CDV, the petitioner's counsel Anshuman Singh said. It appears there might be a deviation from the obligations arising from the provisions of the Wildlife Protection Act and the NTCA framework, Singh submitted.

"The government of India should commit at least one-third of the required investment to de-risk projects and anchor long-term investor confidence," it said. This, the report said, can in turn crowd in private capital at scale. Fabs, advanced packaging, compound semiconductors and critical design infrastructure should be prioritised for public funding. "Alongside funding support, the focus should also be on stability, predictable incentives and coordinated execution across the value chain," it said. The court further directed that where delay in delivering a reasoned judgment could cause hardship and urgent orders are necessary, the operative portion may be pronounced in open court. The reasoned judgment must then be uploaded within seven days or, where practical difficulties arise, within a maximum of 15 days. Such situations may include habeas corpus petitions, criminal appeals resulting in acquittal and matters relating to demolition. Reasoned judgments pronounced in open court must be uploaded on the High Court website within 24 hours. Where only the operative portion is pronounced, the reasoned judgment must be uploaded within 15 days, Live Law reports. To monitor compliance, the Supreme Court directed Chief Justices of High Courts to ensure necessary changes are made to court websites so that automated monthly emails identify all reserved matters pending during that month. Copies of such communications should also be sent to the bench concerned. Chief Justices have also been asked to consider circulating confidential lists of cases in which judgments remain undelivered for more than two months after being reserved.

Donation money used for VIP hospitality at Kedarnath?

A major controversy has erupted over the alleged use of devotees' donation money for the hospitality of politicians and VIP guests at Kedarnath Dham, prompting the Badri-Kedar Temple Committee (BKTC) to order a high-level inquiry into the matter. The issue surfaced after information obtained through a Right to Information (RTI) application allegedly revealed that thousands of rupees were spent on accommodation, food and other arrangements for political leaders, their family members and influen-

According to details that surfaced through the RTI, nearly Rs 60,000 was allegedly spent within two days during the visit of BJP leader Neha Joshi, daughter of Uttarakhand cabinet minister Ganesh Joshi. The records also re-

portedly showed an expenditure of around Rs 37,500 in the name of Kedarnath MLA Asha Nautiyal. The revelations triggered outrage on social media, with questions being raised over whether funds collected through donation boxes at one of Hinduism's holiest shrines were being diverted for VIP hospitality instead of temple management and pilgrim welfare.

As criticism mounted, BKTC chairman Hemant Dwivedi announced the formation of a four-member inquiry committee to investigate the allegations. The panel, which includes the BKTC chief executive officer and finance controller, has been directed to submit its report within 20 days. Dwivedi said the matter came to his notice through RTI documents and discussions on social media, after which immediate action was initiated. "Allegations that donation money offered by devotees was spent on VIP hospitality are a serious matter. A four-member committee has been constituted to conduct a detailed investigation. The report will also be sent to the government," he said. The committee will examine financial records, adminis-

trative approvals and expenditure patterns linked to the visits of politicians and VIP guests. Officials said the panel is also likely to interact with those whose names appeared in the RTI disclosures. The controversy has put the temple committee under intense scrutiny, particularly at a time when Kedarnath continues to witness a massive inflow of pilgrims and donations every year. Following the backlash, Neha Joshi and the Rudraprayag district administration also went separately to the BKTC chairman. Most political leaders whose names surfaced in the documents have

reportedly maintained that they paid for their visits personally and did not avail any special financial assistance from the temple committee. Dwivedi, however, cautioned against drawing conclusions before the inquiry is completed. He also suggested that the controversy could be part of an attempt to tarnish the image of the temple committee and the state government. "It is possible that this is part of a larger conspiracy. The actual facts will become clear only after the investigation is completed. Strict action will be taken against anyone found guilty," he said.

Pradhan assures early end to CBSE OSM crisis

Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan, who on Thursday took responsibility for the On-Screen Marking (OSM) controversy in CBSE paper evaluation, on Friday expressed sympathy for students' concerns and said experts from the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) had been roped in to resolve the crisis. Speaking to the media after a meeting with public sector banks on streamlining the CBSE paper re-evaluation payment system, Pradhan said the issue had now been "largely resolved" and additional technical support had been brought in to strengthen the system. He said more than four lakh students had applied for reassessment and re-evaluation, seeking access to around 11 lakh question sets. According to the minister, students have started receiving these sets. Pradhan said IIT experts had been engaged to improve the portal infrastructure. New payment gateways and PSU banks have also been brought in to stabilise the system. "We are fixing the portal and IIT experts have been brought in," he said, adding that the system would be stabilised within "a day or two". The minister said that once



the portal became fully operational, students who had received scanned copies of their evaluated answer sheets would be able to raise online queries regarding specific questions, missing pages or other discrepancies. "This process also existed earlier. Students will be able to submit online queries regarding discrepancies or concerns related to their answer sheets," he added.

Explaining the rationale behind introducing the OSM system this year, Pradhan said answer sheets were earlier evaluated manually, mostly within the same zone. Even then, students often complained of lower marks, partially or receiving fewer marks than expected. He said the technology-driven OSM system had been adopted by several institutions globally and was introduced by CBSE as part of broader reforms. According to the minister, more than 17 lakh students appeared for CBSE examinations this year, of whom nearly four lakh expressed dissatisfaction with their results. Pradhan also claimed that a sudden surge in applications put pressure on the CBSE portal, leading to technical glitches and temporary disruptions.

16 dead in UP storms, bridge slab collapse

At least 16 people were killed across Uttar Pradesh after a powerful storm accompanied by heavy rain lashed several districts late Thursday night and early Friday morning, causing widespread destruction, accidents and disruption of normal life. The worst tragedy was reported from Hamirpur district, where six labourers died after a slab of an under-construction bridge over the Betwa river collapsed during the storm. The accident took place around 2 am in Lalpura area, nearly 25 km from the Hamirpur district headquarters. According to officials, labourers working on the under-construction bridge had taken shelter beneath the structure when strong winds and rain hit the area. Moments later, a massive slab collapsed, trapping workers under the debris. Teams of the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) launched a rescue operation that continued for nearly seven-and-a-half hours. Three injured workers trapped in the rubble were rescued and shifted for treatment, while six labourers were found dead. Officials said four of the deceased were residents of Banda district and two belonged to Hamirpur. Rescue teams continued clearing debris even after the operation officially ended to ensure that no worker remained trapped. A labourer who survived the accident said two shifts were working on the bridge project. According to him, workers from the first shift were resting under the bridge while seven labourers from the second shift were still working on the structure when the storm intensified.



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ED attaches Rs 634 cr assets linked to Unitech

The Enforcement Directorate on Friday said it has attached assets worth Rs 634 crore of a prominent realty project of the Unitech Group in Noida as part of a money laundering investigation linked to alleged fraud with homebuyers. A provisional order has been issued under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) to attach properties connected with the Unitech Golf and Country Club (UGCC) Project situated in Sectors 96, 97 and 98 of Noida, Uttar Pradesh, the central agency said in a statement. The attachment includes leasehold rights over 347.83 acres of land and equity shareholdings held through consortium/special purpose company (SPC) structures involving Sungrace Products (India) Pvt. Ltd. (Uflex Group) and CIG Infrastructure Pvt. Ltd., it said.
